Fair Helps Mark National Preparedness Month

WHAT: Cook County's Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Management

(DHSEM) is partnering with government agencies, nonprofits and private sector organizations to ensure residents have the information they need to stay safe in an emergency – whether manmade or natural. As part of National Preparedness Month,

DHSEM is hosting a preparedness fair at Daley Plaza.
